 - Lisa Gloss (<u>lmgloss@wsu.edu</u>), Dean of the Graduate School
 - Graduate school focuses on three areas: Service, Oversight, and Advocacy
 - If the graduate school can help, then please let them know. They want to be your advocates and serve you. They can give a voice and different perspectives on different issues.
 - Office Hours with the Dean
 - Dr. Gloss wants to be available to students. They want to hear your ideas on how to fix things.
 - PDI
 - <u>Graduate Mentor Academy</u>
 - Group of about 30–40 faculty that they help to be a graduate liaison. This is to help with preliminary/qualifying examinations. They automatically send a liaison if it is a second examination. Need to know about 15 days in advance when scheduling examinations (rather than the typical 10 days).
 - Make sure that concerns are addressed even if it is something within a college.
 - Funding for assistantships is at the college level
 - The graduate school can be an advocate for graduate students.
 - If there are issues with students working over 20 hours a week, then the graduate school needs to know about those issues.
 - Question: What to do when faculty ask for you to come to campus when the weather is bad?
 - Answer: Faculty are not allowed to ask you to come to campus when campus is closed.
 - Question: Are there levels of having to attend when the weather is bad?
 - Answer: If campus and labs are closed, then you should not have to be on campus.

 - Major changes with the Executive Policy 15
 - Going through last iterations before being emailed out to students
 - When graduate students come to their office, graduate students are afraid to share information because of fears of retaliation, since many times your future, references, etc. get wrapped up in advisors, etc.
 - In EP15, there will be clarification in what you can report. Many of the definitions have been expanded. There is also an appendix to help give examples of the categories to make it more tangible than the more legalistic language that is required in the document itself.
 - Expanded the jurisdiction like WSU, WSU-related events, impacting your ability to succeed (even if off-campus).
 - There are many reporting options, like confidential reporting. You can also come into the office and find out the options for reporting, documenting, finding resources, consultation, investigations, etc.
