- 6:00-6:15 Dialogue with Dean Gloss- Q & A Pre-submitted questions
 - Q1. What is the likelihood of vaccinations for faculty, staff, and students? Return to in-person learning in the Fall? Is the university working towards getting faculty, staff, and graduate students COVID vaccination this semester?
 - I hope I know the answer to these questions, but the email that was shared from the Graduate School on Monday 1/25/2021 is the university update.
 - Vaccination of the faculty and students is a topic related to the state and the governor. There is a link for vaccine phase finder and vaccine



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location that will help students to get informed: https://www.doh.wa.gov/Emergencies/COVID19/vaccine Or https://www.doh.wa.gov/Emergencies/COVID19/VaccineInformation/

- It is a phase finder tool from the state Department of Health. You can also put in contact information optionally to get a message when you may be eligible for a vaccine.
- Q2. Do graduate students qualify as "University educators" in WA's later list of important workers?
 - There is an argument about adding the graduate students on the teaching assistantship to this category as well. There is some talk about it with the governor at the university level, and it might not happen until late in the spring semester.
- Q3. Can or will the grad school mandate COVID-19 testing multiple times per semester?
 - I cannot mandate it, but I would encourage students to get the test on a periodic basis until the free testing is available on the campus. It is recently mandated for the new arrival graduate students.

- Q4. Can you please provide an update on the efforts that we discussed last semester on improving mentorship training for professors who mentor grad students?
 - A couple of readings from the University of Michigan and the University of Cornell have been done to see how the training is for them. Also, some people have identified with some taskforce related to this issue. The Graduate school will contact the associate dean of each college and will be provided with the training documents to share with the faculties.
- Q5. Despite recommendations about lightening coursework or adjusting milestone deadlines, many professors continue to maintain high expectations during what is an especially draining time. What advice do you have for graduate students who are overwhelmed and have been unsuccessful in communicating this with their mentors or professors?
 - Try to have a zoom meeting with your advisor one more time related to this issue. If this is not helpful, there are some resources for the students. Find a neutral party like Ombudsman if your department has



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one of them and please let your department chair know about this issue.

- Q6. From your perspective, what are the most important graduate students' concerns the administration should be working on, and what initiatives are underway in these areas?
 - The topics that the GPSA working groups are currently working on are the top priority such as stipend levels. I have reviewed all the stipend levels in different programs that are about a hundred thousand lines of the data in the excel that I am piling up in the 5000 lines of data. A report about this stipend level is being prepared for the Provost. We know that the stipend is low, but we need to figure out how low it is. This report will be shared with the GPSA executive board as an aggregated data not raw. The reason for sharing aggregated information is to be fair to the department that has few graduate students and sharing information can be counted as personal data
 - The second important topic is taking care of students' health concerns. Last year one graduate assistantship was specified to work in the health promotions area. She put together a survey and analyzed the data of what are the concerns and problems and mental health for the students. This information has shared with the president and provost.
 - The other problem is that the healthcare insurances are not covering as much as they were doing in the past and the costs are high as most of the Lab blood testing that is done by the third party.
 - Another related issue is negotiating the health insurance that GPS is working on it as well. We need to be sure that there is no more erosion on the insurance coverage.
- Q7. What will be the format for classes for summer/fall 2021? Along the same lines, what does a potential transition back to in-person in the fall look like?
 - Summer is planned but it is related to the COVID. Summer will be hybrid of virtual and in-person classes. For fall it is planned for robust in-person classes. It will be related to the vaccination and the COVID.
- Q8. Is there any chance of an in-person graduation ceremony this spring? If so, what would be the necessary conditions for this event to occur?



- The chance of having an in-person graduation ceremony is zero. They are trying something new that is a virtual online system-wide graduation ceremony for all of the campuses at the same time instead of having separate ceremonies.
- We will try something to recognize our graduate students separately.

 - Jennifer Johnson (President and Executive Board Chair): Attending a lot of meetings such as university meetings and communicate with the president of WSU, provost, dean of the graduate school, and quick checkin and answer. President needs to be able to answer the positives and negative emails and try to help solve the problem of the students.
 - Samantha Edgerton (Executive Vice President and Budget Chair): Facilitate senate meetings, gathering information for the agenda, editing senate meeting minutes, and send it out. Most of the vice-president's duty is around the budget and contact the budget committee and deal with the costs and budget cuts.
 - James Dalton (VP of Legislative Affairs and Legislative Affairs Chair): Attend a lot of meetings and focus on the advocacy of the GPSA. During the spring semester, it is heavy on the legislative session. Mostly heavy work on a topic related to the Federal government and legislative-based topics.
 - Anika VanDeen (PDI Chair and College Representative representing Voiland College of Engineering and Architecture): Working with executive PDI committees. Set up the PDI events in the early semester and this semester was setting up zoom links. An in-person meeting was like providing food and set up a room.
 - **Rachel Wong** (Programming Chair and College representing Representative College of Education): Organizing social events with students. Purchasing supplies and gift cards for the events. This year it was virtual.



- **Mikala Meize** (Internal Affairs Chair and College Representative representing College of Communication): Monitoring and maintaining the By Laws and constitutions. They update every year and if it is not working, it will be changed next year. The general election is under the control of internal affairs and gathers the data and votes.
- Adnan Mohamed (Communication Chair and College Representative At-Large representing CAHNRS): As a College Representative, duties include meeting CAHNRS dean and CAHNRS senators to answer students' questions, address their concerns (i.e., stipend, health care, housing, transportation), and provide resources to help students. As a Communication Chair, duties include attending GPSA Executive Board meetings and GPSA Senate Meetings, taking GPSA Senate Meeting notes and Executive Board Meeting notes, updating the website, creating pages for resources and events on the website, sharing resources on GPSA Social Media, promoting events and resources on GPSA Social Media, working with WSU marketing and communication team to publish the bi-weekly Monday Minutes Newsletter, working with the GPSA communication committee, managing GPSA emails, and managing GPSA communication budget.
- Rabayet Sadnan (Awards & Scholarship Chair and College Representative representing College of Business): Arrange three events like dissertation grants, Research Expo, and then the Excellence Award. These events' applications need to be evaluated and get analyzed.
- Anastasia Vishnevskaya (University and Student Affairs Chair and College Representative At-Large representing the Graduate School): Monitoring the issues related to the graduate and professional students on campus and tries to resolve the issue. Working groups like the three working groups that we had this year like housing, healthcare, and the stipend.

This committee is active during the summer as well since there is funding available.  - There are three working groups this year:
 - Healthcare: Push to reduce the cost of healthcare for the students and independence. Resources for healthcare are limited and we don't know about the R&E student's health insurance and their resources. Dental is expensive.
 - Stipend: In the middle of the process since there is limited information about the stipend available to students
 - Housing: We have collected from Pullman and R&E centers and the information will be shared on the website. What is clear is that the housing costs are not comparable with the stipend level. The average housing has increased in the last 10 years, but the stipend has not changed.

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Proposed Exception to the Bylaws

- I. Current Bylaws:
 - a. Article VII: Elections
 - i. Specifically addressing the timeline of the General Election
 - ii. Dates of the General Election are determined based on the dates of Spring Break.
 - 1. Executive Board Candidate Debate: occurs the Monday preceding Spring Break.
 - 2. General Election Ballot: available immediately following the Executive Board Candidate Debate until the Friday preceding Spring Break.
 - 3. Preliminary Results: posted to the GPSA website the first Monday following Spring Break.
 - 4. Confirmation Vote: first Senate following Spring Break.

II. Proposed Exception:

- a. Article VII: Elections
 - i. For the General Election taking place in the 2021 Spring Semester, all aspects of the General Election will proceed as if the week of March 15th were still Spring Break.
 - ii. This specifically affects the Executive Board Candidate Debate, the General Election Ballot availability, the posting of the Preliminary Results, and the Confirmation Vote from the Senate.
 - 1. Executive Board Candidate Debate: occurs the Monday preceding the week of March 15th.
 - 2. General Election Ballot: available immediately following the Executive Board Candidate Debate until the Friday preceding the week of March 15th.
 - 3. Preliminary Results: posted to the GPSA website the first Monday following the week of March 15th.
 - 4. Confirmation Vote: first Senate following the week of March 15th.
